Information for the application of Permits.

Secretaries of both Requesting and Requested Bands should make themselves familiar with the sections of the QBA By-Laws (*for State & Regional Competition*) and the NBCA Year Book (*for National Competitions*) relating to the Request and Approval for Permit Players. The relevant section 12 from the QBA By-Laws (2008) and sections 4.10 & 9.10 from the NBCA Contest Regulations (2009) are reproduced below for your information.

QBA By-Laws 2008 section 12 - PERMITS

Application for a permit player shall be made in writing to the Registrar of the QBA not less than fourteen (14) days before contests. These applications should be forwarded on the appropriate form. The Permit Player must be an active player/conductor of the Parent Band.

The allocation of permits is as follows:

State Championship – three (3) brass players and sufficient percussion for the requirements of the score.

District Competitions – four (4) brass players and sufficient percussion for the requirements of the score.

As well, any Band which has two (2) or more bands registered with the QBA may have an additional two (2) junior players (Under 19 years of age) as permits from the other registered bands in their organisation.

Any band may have as part of their total permits a maximum of one (1) player registered with an overseas band or two (2) players from interstate bands.

Emergency permits may be granted by any two (2) of the following officials; the QBA President, QBA Secretary, QBA Registrar or the QBA Contest Delegate up to and including the day of competition. These emergency permits may be as the result of illness, extenuating family reasons or occupational reasons. The application must be accompanied by a Medical Certificate, Statutory Declaration and/or any other documentation relevant and necessary to support the application. The emergency permit must play the same instrument as the player being replaced. The player being replaced must take no further part in the competition, in any capacity.

An emergency permit player must be a registered player of another Queensland band or the nominated conductor of another Queensland band at that contest.

QBA By-Laws 2008 section 20.7 – Solo & Party Competitions

Competitors in Party Competitions shall consist only of the registered members of the same band and/or band administered by the same parent body.

NBCA 2009 Yearbook & Contest Regulations - REGULATION 4.10 (Amended June 1999, 2001, 2006)

Applications for Permit Players shall be made in writing to the affiliated State Governing Body with which the Band is registered not later than fourteen (14) days prior to the commencing date of any Contest.

The maximum number of Permits for Wind Players to any Brass Band shall be two (2) and to any Concert Band shall be four (4). Bands shall be granted permits for percussion players as required by the score.

A Permit Player shall be a registered member of an affiliated Band as defined in Regulation 4.1.

Where a player is dually registered under a system of Dual Registration for students only, a permit for that player may be granted by the band of the original registration (the primary band).

No Permit for a player shall be granted without the written permission of the band with which the player is registered.

A Permit Player shall be allowed to play an alternative instrument to the one he/she normally plays with his/her own Band when playing on permit with another Band. The permit application must indicate the instrument to be played.

In the case of death or extreme emergency at any time after the granting of Permits in accordance with this Regulation and prior to or during the currency of a Contest, special permission may be granted by the Chief Supervisor, in consultation with the Contest Liaison Officer, to replace such player or players. Any player used as an emergency player must play the same instrument and Band part as the player being replaced.

NBCA 2009 Yearbook & Contest Regulations - REGULATION 9.10 (Amended June 2004)

Competitors in Party Competitions shall consist only of the registered members of the same Band. If a Band has multiple entries in a Party section, it may not include any member in more than one entry. No permit players shall be allowed in party events.
